Secondly, I think everyone would agree that we learnt A LOT during Remote Learning and that there are probably some really important takeaways, some of which may be used to enhance our school when we return to 'normal' operation. Finally, just a reminder that DET have made it very clear that we are not allowed to have visitors on school grounds – please only come onto the grounds if you have a genuine reason to do so, and continue to observe the 1.5 mtr distancing rule when waiting outside school gates. I really appreciate your support with this over the last fortnight and will let you know as soon as this directive changes.
