## Principals News

### Punctuality

Our day is broken into 5 one hour learning blocks, with each block following a consistent structure:

1 Hour Session	
15 minutes	Explicit Instruction <i>Teacher providing instruction to the whole group about the learning.</i>
35 minutes	Independent Learning Activity <i>Students completing an independent activity applying the learning from the Explicit Instruction.</i>
10 minutes	Sharing and Reflection <i>Students share their learning and teachers 'check in' on their understanding.</i>

As you can see, the first 15 minutes of each session is vitally important to your child's learning and their ability to be able to complete their independent tasks successfully. Rest assured if your child is late as teachers will quickly catch up the students on what they have missed, however a quick 'catch up' with the teacher isn't going to provide the depth of understanding as the explicit instruction. If your child is consistently late (even if it is only 5 minutes), this will have a significant impact on their learning.

**AS such, please aim to have your child at school between 8:40 and 8:55am so that they are in class and ready to learn from 9:00am.**

### Reports

We have been busily assessing students and writing reports these last few weeks in order to provide you with an accurate account of your child/ren's learning and their current progression.

Reports will be sent home on the last day of term (Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June). Please take the time to read all reports carefully prior to Parent Teacher Student Conferences.

### Parent Teacher Student Conferences

### Compass

Compass School Manager is a whole school administration package. Compass has many features however we currently use it predominately for attendance and reporting. As a school we are wanting to increase our use of Compass to make life easier for both school and parents. As of the beginning of next term, **you will have access to Compass.** We will be sending home a letter to each family which will have instructions on how to access Compass (web or phone app.) and your individual log in details. We will give you a few weeks to have a play and familiarise yourselves with the program and then we will hold an informal afternoon session on the 14<sup>th</sup> August to provide support and answer any questions you may have.

## **Child Safety Standards** **What to expect at TOORA PRIMARY SCHOOL**

- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- We request your support and cooperation to help us keep children safe.
- ALL visitors, including family members, are required to sign in (and out) at the school office. You may be required to wear a visitor's badge and/or a name badge.
- We have policies and processes in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children. These will continually be updated to ensure a zero tolerance approach to child abuse.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with the children here.
- The new Australia-wide Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- The child safe standards apply to school staff (including volunteers and contractors), visitors, parents/carers and family members.
- Contractors and volunteers will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working at the school during school hours and/or when children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school.
- Other people using our school facilities will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of using our facilities, if they involve children enrolled at the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while their staff or other adults are at the school).
- Please note that Working With Children's Checks are required for all volunteers in our school.
