Attendance

Attendance will continue to be a priority for our school this year as the research shows that anything below 95% (missing more than 1 day a month) starts to impact on a child's learning. We fully understand that at times being away cannot be helped (and encourage you to keep your child at home if they are unwell), but we do request that days off for any other reason than illness are kept to a minimum. We also ask that students are punctual in the morning as even being ten minutes late can result in your child missing the vital instruction time at the beginning of a lesson. If your child is away from school, please add an attendance note through Compass at your earliest convenience. Details on how to do this is attached to this Newsletter. Please notify the Admin office if you are having difficulty logging in or navigating around the app, we are happy to assist you.

Parent Teacher 'Get to Know You' Conferences - Wednesday 21st February

Parent Teacher 'Get to Know You' Conferences will be held on Wednesday 21st February between 1:00pm and 4:40pm. Your child's education is a partnership between you, your child and our school, and these conferences are an important part of developing that partnership for 2024. These conferences are a great opportunity for you to have a chat to your child's teacher about how they have started, ask any questions about how the class will be run this year and share any information that may help the teacher work with your child. Please book a conference time through COMPASS.

Swimming

Swimming has started back up for **5/6 students** with swim trials in preparation for District Swimming. Lessons will begin for all students **Prep—Year 6 on Thursday 15h February** and will continue every Thursday through to Thursday 14h March. Swimming Lessons will be provided free of charge to all students however we do require permission slips to be completed via COMPASS and let Di in the School Admin office know if you hold a current family swimming membership.

CAMPS, SPORT & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. An application form is included in this newsletter.

SunSmart Hats

Our SunSmart policy requires everyone to wear a SunSmart hat (wide brim or legionnaires) during Terms 1 and 4. Can you please ensure that your child/ren has a SunSmart hat to wear when outside (this does not need to be a school hat). School hats are back in stock! \$12.00 each, please inquire at office if you wish to purchase a hat.

Friday Lunch Orders from the Windmill Café

We are very grateful that the Windmill Cafe are offering our students lunch orders again in 2024. Lunch orders need to be ordered online through Compass by 12 noon the day prior (Thursday).

All items are \$5

Thursday Pie Warmer Lunch

Students are given the opportunity to have a hot lunch each Thursday.

Students are able to bring a pie/pastie/
sausage roll etc (basically anything that can be wrapped in foil and reheated in the oven) wrapped in foil with their name clearly written on the outside, staff place these in the staffroom oven ready for lunchtime.

SOMERS Camp - EOI

Every 2 years Toora PS (Gippsland Region) is offered a limited number of places for its Grade 5/6 students at the Department of Education and Training's Somers School Camp. This year our allotted time is **April 16th to April 25th 2024**. Cost of the 9 day camp is \$260. PRIVACY COLLECTION STATEMENT – Primary Schools

Information for parents and carers

During the ordinary course of your child's attendance at our school, school staff will collect your child's personal and health information when necessary to educate your child, or to support your child's social and emotional wellbeing or health in the school context. Such information will also be collected when required to fulfil a legal obligation, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law. If that information is not collected, the school may be unable to provide optimal education or support to your child, or fulfil those legal obligations.

For example, health information may be collected through the school nurse, primary welfare officer or wellbeing staff member. If your child is referred to a specific health service at school, such as a Student Support Services officer, the required consent will be obtained. Our school also collects information provided by parents and carers through the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

Our school may use online tools, such as apps and other software, to effectively collect and manage information about your child for teaching and learning purposes, parent communication and engagement; student administration; and school management purposes. When our school uses these online tools, we take steps to ensure that your child's information is secure. If you have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact us.

School staff will only share your child's personal or health information with other staff who need to know to enable the school to educate or support your child, or fulfil a legal obligation.

When our students transfer to another Victorian government school, personal and health information about that student will be transferred to that next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of our students and assists that next school to provide optimal education and support to students.

In some limited circumstances, information may be disclosed outside of the school (and outside of the Department of Education and Training). The school will seek your consent for such disclosures unless the disclosure is allowed or mandated by law.

Our school values the privacy of every person. When collecting and managing personal and health information, all school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law. For more information about privacy including about how to access personal and health information held by the school about you or your child, see our school's privacy policy:

Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, Student Support Service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners and all other staff at our school. This includes employees, agents and service providers (contractors) of the Department, whether paid or unpaid.

An important reminder regarding safety in our school

All late arrivals and early pick up of students <u>must be logged through the iPad</u> at the front office.

This is to ensure that, in the case of an emergency, all staff are aware of student numbers onsite.

BUS COMMUNICATIONS

 It is school practice to follow the last notification by parents / carers regarding bus travel and not rely on verbal messages relayed by students.
 If a misunderstanding occurs or there is confusion, we endeavour to contact parents.



- 2. Parents/Carers of bus travellers who are not going home on the bus on any given afternoon **MUST** notify the office prior to the end of the day. A phone call or note to school is required.
- 3. If the arrangements are permanent, eg: Cricket training for the whole of Term 4, please request a 'Change of Arrangement' form from the office. At conclusion of your child's participation it is your responsibility to contact the office and the arrangements revert back.



Having new whiteboard tables in our classroom has made the students very excited to play a range


of different maths games.

Lunch Box Corner

Rhubarb

I'm sure like me, that many of you have an abundance of rhubarb in the garden currently. Cooked rhubarb with some added sweetness is delicious with yoghurt, muesli or ice cream or simply eaten on its own. Stewing apples with the rhubarb is also a great option and is perfect for a pie filling.

To stew rhubarb:

Discard the leaves as these are poisonous. Wash the stems and cut into 3-4cm chunks. Place in a saucepan. Add a good splash of orange juice. You could also add some finely grated rind if you wish. For sweetness, add a few heaped tablespoons of honey or brown sugar. Mix through the rhubarb.

Heat the rhubarb on the stove top and bring to a gentle simmer. Give it a stir and then turn off the heat. Not only is it delicious, rhubarb is a good source of vitamin C, vitamin K, potassium and manganese. Enjoy!



Year 3/4 Classroom News



students have focused on quality sentence structure incorporating noun, verb, adjective and adverb components into their sentences.




